Funding available for community groups

Voluntary and community groups in Carlton Colville, Kessingland, Southwold and the surrounding villages are set to benefit from a new funding scheme launching soon.

The Carlton Colville, Kessingland, Southwold and villages Community Partnership will open its Small Grants Scheme for applications on 31 October. The Partnership has allocated £10,000 in total and welcomes applications for projects which aim to tackle social isolation and loneliness, improve opportunities for young people and support rural communities.

Funding will be available for projects which include activities that can help individuals, groups and families or which benefit the wider community, either as a one off or as a series of events, purchasing equipment to support community activity, and targeted projects which address specific needs linked to the Partnership's priorities.

Cllr Alan Green, Chair of the Community Partnership and ward councillor for Kessingland, said: "I am pleased to launch the Small Grants Scheme which supports the good work being carried out by local community and voluntary groups in the area and will help them deliver projects which positively impact on the lives of local residents."

The scheme, which will be open for applications until 25 November will offer grants of up to £1,000.




MP for Lowestoft Jess Asato Will Host a Public Meeting on 'Assisted Dying for Terminally III Adults Bill'

Lowestoft, Suffolk:

Jess Asato, MP for Lowestoft, will host a public meeting on **Friday, 15th November 2024**, to discuss the 'Assisted Dying for Terminally III Adults Bill'.

Taking place at the Players Theatre in Lowestoft, this meaningful event aims to bring together local constituents to share their views, hear perspectives from all sides, and participate in an open discussion on the subject.

Jess Asato has organised the public meeting as part of her commitment to listening to the community on complex and sensitive issues. "The Assisted Dying for Terminally III Adults Bill has sparked considerable debate across the country, and I want to ensure my constituents have the opportunity to voice their views," Asato stated. "This is a deeply personal and ethical matter, and I am committed to hearing from the people of Lowestoft and surrounding areas as we consider the impact of potential legislative changes."





The event will include presentations from speakers with a range of perspectives on the Assisted Dying for Terminally III Adults Bill, followed by a Q&A session, offering attendees the chance to engage directly with the topic.

"I hope this event will provide a respectful and meaningful forum where we can explore the diverse views that make this issue so complex," said Asato. "I look forward to listening to my constituents as we navigate this important discussion together."

Kessingland Climate Change Group



The groups' aims are to identify where we can reduce our contribution to global emissions, and make a difference towards becoming environmentally sustainable, both as individuals and as groups. To find practical ways for the local community to meet the challenges of climate change.

Thermal Imaging:

Our Thermal Imaging Project where homeowners can actually see where they are losing heat from their homes and how that can be remedied, what financial help is available etc. is moving forward with several members of the group having signed up for Energy Advisor Training and how to interpret Thermal Images. This training is being delivered on behalf of the Suffolk Climate Change Partnership which consists of all of Suffolk's Local Authorities.

Recycling updates:

From 2025 the Council will be starting to collect food waste and separated recycling from homes.

Energy saving:

EDF are running a scheme called Sunday Saver, if you reduce your energy use Monday to Friday between 4pm & 7pm then you can earn a certain number of hours of free electricity the following Sunday. A useful scheme as it really makes you think about how you use your energy during those peak times, on the following Sunday you can maximise your free electricity by batch cooking, extra wash loads, charging up laptops, tool batteries etc.

Local Food:

With the need to cut down our carbon emissions it makes sense to use food produced locally and in the UK rather than transported from around the world.
