Lowestoft's Gull Wing bridge will open to the public with a community walkabout on the bridge on Saturday 7th September, heralding a new era of connectivity and regeneration for the town.

To celebrate this important milestone for Lowestoft, members of the public are invited to experience the Gull Wing before it opens to traffic. From 9am to 11:30am on Saturday 7th September, the bridge will be open exclusively to pedestrians. It is hoped this opportunity will allow the public to experience the unique scale and design of the bridge up close, as well as grab a selfie and check out the views, without any traffic.

From noon, the bridge will open to vehicles as well, with vintage Lowestoft buses from the East Anglian Transport Museum leading the way.

Parking is not available so those planning to attend the event are encouraged to use public transport or travel by foot where possible.

A rolling road closure will be in effect on the morning of Sunday 8th September, as the Tour of Britain crosses the Gull Wing during their preliminary ride-out ahead of the final stage between Lowestoft and Felixstowe.

The formal civic opening and naming ceremony for the bridge is set to take place on Tuesday 19th November. Additional details will be provided closer to the date.

The Tour of Britain 2024





East Suffolk will hold the final stage of Britain's biggest professional cycle race on Sunday 8 September for the first time, with a 158-kilometre (98.5-mile) stage between Lowestoft and Felixstowe.

Stage six will get underway at 10:30 from Lowestoft's Promenade, the first time that the town has hosted the Lloyds Bank Tour of Britain Men, with the stage heading inland via Beccles and Bungay, and then south through Halesworth, Framlingham, and Saxmundham, before racing along the Suffolk coast between Thorpeness and Aldeburgh.

The second half of the route takes in Snape, Wickham Market, Kesgrave, and Martlesham, before a run in and finish on Sea Road in Felixstowe familiar to riders from 12-months ago, when Wout van Aert took a stage win in Suffolk.

To mark the occasion, **First Light Festival** and **East Point Pavilion** are holding a day of celebration on Sunday 8 September on Royal Green. Come along to watch the race begin on the promenade and then stay to enjoy activities for all ages, live entertainment and workshops.

To ensure safety for the race, it will be necessary to close some roads, and to suspend parking in some of the towns and villages on the route. To minimise inconvenience, East Suffolk Council will endeavour to remove cones and lift restrictions as soon as possible after the race has passed through. There will also be a rolling road closure in operation across the route for around 15 minutes before the estimated time of arrival until approximately 10 minutes after the last rider has passed.

Road Closures & Parking Suspensions:

The following roads will be closed between 10.30am and 11am on Sunday 8 September:

- B1532 From A47 to Royal Terrace
- Royal Terrace

Parking will be suspended between 9am and 12noon on the following roads on Sunday 8 September:

- Marine Parade/B1532 (4 x bays outside No. 6)
- Claremont Road (Wellington Esplanade to London Road South)
- London Road South (5 x bays opposite KFC)

Hoppy - The story of an extraordinary Ringed Plover

The team first spotted Hoppy a male Ringed plover easily distinguished by the lack of his left foot hence his name, in June of 2022. Hoppy soon found a partner and they nested just behind the portacabin at Winterton. Hoppy and his partner successfully fledged 2 chicks.

On 10th June 2023 Hoppy returned to Winterton, paired up and again they chose to nest just behind the portacabin at Winterton and also working with his partner successfully fledged 2 chicks.





Hoppy and his footprints in the sand were spotted by Mick on 17th May 2024, our very special boy was back. However, Hoppy was going to be in for a very rough time, on the 1st June high tides with very strong winds arrived and poor Hoppy sitting on 4 eggs was almost totally covered in sand. Mick managed to come to the rescue and unburied the eggs which were a few inches down and would have not been viable without Mick's intervention.



On Monday 9th June Hoppy was seen babysitting 2 chicks again amongst high tides and strong winds the sand was blowing everywhere, and seafoam was all over the beach. The high deposits of sand must be like climbing Mount Everest for Hoppy and his chicks.





Hoppy always nests very close to the portacabin inside the fencing, so he seems to realise that we offer him protection and give him the best chance of success, like a typical Ring Plover he is a very feisty little character, and he seems to do more than his fair share of incubating, brooding and babysitting.

A remarkable story of one little bird's survival against adversity, battling the elements, overcoming a disability and being a great father.

We could all learn a lot from Hoppy.

Fingers crossed those little chicks get to fledge and Hoppy keeps coming back to breed for many more years.

July Book Club review: The Forgotten Bookshop by Daisy Wood

This book was a charming easy read, if a bit predictable, and some of our members felt they had read stories with very similar plots and characters.


The book covers two time spans - the first being 1940's German occupied Paris and the second some 80 years later in current day thriving Paris.

1940's - follows the story of bookshop owner Jacques and his wife Mathilde as their lives are restricted by the strict Nazi regime. Mathilde is very outspoken and joins the Resistance but has to go into hiding for fear of her life, not knowing if she would ever return to Jacques or Paris. Watching the persecution of the Jews and the banning of their books Jacques hides any that come to him in a secret room in his shop for future generations. He also slowly finds himself becoming involved in helping people in desperate need by hiding them in this secret room until they can be moved on. This is made trickier by a book-loving Nazi officer who frequents the bookshop knowing that Jacques keeps a collection of unusual, hard to obtain books.

Current day - Juliette and Kevin come to Paris for a romantic getaway and to research her heritage. Realising just how far apart they have grown Kevin returns to the States alone, leaving Juliette searching for a particular location, which is the subject of a picture she has inherited from her Parisian grandmother. Purely by accident she comes across this square where she finds a rundown bookshop which is up for sale. Deciding that she wants a new direction in her life and with her children now adults, Juliette decides not to return to the States but to buy this bookshop and re- open it. During the renovations she finds documents that link her to the shop and the people who had once lived there.

The group felt that historically it was accurate, a book you could easily follow through the two time spans, and a good holiday read.

We gave it a 7/10.

Community Kitchen & Wildlife Garden


