CityFibre - Project Gigabit

CityFibre has been awarded the Project Gigabit project for Suffolk which is the UK government's flagship programme to enable hard-to-reach communities to access fast gigabit-capable broadband.

Advance warning has been given that work is due to start in the Kessingland area over the next few weeks. The exact start date is unknown but as soon as dates are confirmed, the community will be informed.

The contractor carrying out the work on CityFibre's behalf is OCU Utility Services. Wherever possible, existing duct and pole infrastructure will be used to reduce the amount of construction required. However, new infrastructure will be needed, and CityFibre are working closely with Suffolk council's highways team to coordinate any work that is required.




The hall and lounge are available to hire for Wakes they are free but with a returnable deposit. We have a large carpark with disabled parking and disable access/facilities.

Dogs are also welcome into the Garden, but please remember to keep them on leads & clear up after them.



How do you deal with nuisance calls?

Suffolk Trading Standards have put together the following top tips to help reduce the scam and nuisance calls that you might be receiving:

1 - Register with the Telephone Preference Service (TPS). This will stop legitimate companies from making unsolicited sales and marketing calls to your phone number, so when you receive a call, you'll know a scammer is on the other end of the line.



2 - Consider installing a call blocker. Talk to your home phone provider. Most of the major landline phone providers now offer a free service to reduce the number of nuisance calls that you receive.

3 - Screen your phone calls. Consider only answering calls from numbers you recognise. Legitimate callers are likely to leave a message.

4 - Call 159 if you receive a call claiming to be from your bank. When you call, you'll be put through to your bank's genuine customer service line. Be aware that scammers may be able to keep your phone line open even after you've hung up, so if you hang up on a dodgy call, use a different phone to call the company back on a trusted number or wait for at least 10 to 15 minutes.

5 - Report phone scams.

How to report phone scams:

Registering with the Telephone Preference Service will stop you getting nuisance calls, but if someone's still bothering you 28 days after registering, then report them to the Telephone Preference Service.

You can report nuisance calls or texts to the Information Commissioner's Office. They can fine companies that break the law.

Companies calling you about PPI claims, personal injury claims or other claims can't call you unless you've told them they can. If they call without your permission, you can report them to the Information Commissioner's Office.

If you receive a spam call on an iPhone, you can report it to your provider by texting the word 'call' followed by the phone number to 7726.


If you have an Android phone, text the word 'call' to 7726. You'll then receive a message asking you for the scam number.

For scam calls received on WhatsApp, open the WhatsApp chat with the dodgy phone number and tap 'block.' You can report the contact by tapping 'report contact' and 'block'.

You can also report scam calls to Action Fraud.





The key qualities for a councillor are to keep an open mind and to listen to, learn about, care for and represent your community to the best of your ability.

Applying is easy, there is a short form which you can collect from the parish council or download online. Just complete and either email or drop it off at the council. You'll be invited to attend a Parish Council meeting (generally the second Wednesday each month) and tell the council more about yourself, what you can bring to the council and what you would like to achieve for the community.

VACANCY FOR VOLUNTEER CLERK/SECRETARY

Kessingland Help In Need Trust are seeking an experienced administrator to provide clerical and financial support to the Trust.

The Trust receives applications from members of the Kessingland Community who are in need of assistance due to financial reasons. Therefore a basic knowledge of data protection and an empathetic manner is important.

You would be required to take minutes and prepare agendas for their quarterly meetings.

In addition to this, you would need to record expenditure and income and prepare annual accounts.

The Trust owns a number of plots of land for which it receives annual rent and from time to time there is administration required relating to this land.

Hours of Work

On average, you would only be required to work a couple of hours per month, but this may vary according to demand.

Experience Required

A general knowledge of Email, Word and Excel is required and a basic understanding of the Data Protection Act would be useful, although not essential.
