Danger of Waste Batteries & Electrical Items The fire at Great Blakenham in August resulted in a major response by Suffolk Fire and Rescue Service which saw 14 appliances and more than 80 firefighters deployed to deal with it. Local residents and businesses were advised to keep doors and windows closed for nearly 24 hours as a massive smoke plume, which could be seen for miles, rose above the site. Trains were also severely affected as rail services from Ipswich to Norwich, Cambridge and Ely were cancelled owing to the potential danger from the fire to the adjacent railway track. Suffolk Fire and Rescue Service launched an investigation into the cause, and this has established that the most likely cause was a battery which had made its way into a pile of scrap metal. If batteries, or electricals containing batteries, are not properly separated they can end up being crushed in the waste and recycling process and when punctured they can self-combust, setting fire to any surrounding dry and flammable waste and recycling. The National Fire Chiefs Council (NFCC) said that lithium-ion batteries thrown in household rubbish bins had led to more than 1,200 fires in the UK waste system in the last 12 months, compared to 700 in 2022. Waste batteries and electrical items should never be thrown into household waste. Instead, they can be recycled at any of Suffolk's 11 Recycling Centres, as well as other local recycling banks. Many supermarkets also accept them.

Flood & Water Management at Church Road/Marsh Lane

Suffolk County Council and Anglian Water are working jointly on a scheme to increase surface water drainage capacity on Church Road in the vicinity of Marsh Lane junction. The scheme is now fully funded, and construction works are being organised by Anglian Water. This is proposed to address the surface water run off along Church Road after heavy rainfall to reduce the risk of flooding in the area and it is proposed to install a new section of underground surface water drain and four new road gullies.

The site is complex in terms of construction methods and is physically restricted, and will require partial closure of the road, and for short time, a road closure. The holiday sites accessed via Church Road have been contacted, and provision dates to undertake the works during the least disruptive time for these sites, have been confirmed to be January and early February. Plans are therefore underway with a provisional date for construction in January and early February.



Kessingland Climate Change Group



The group was started about 6 months ago by Robin de Brea because of his concerns for the planet and how climate change has become a serious problem for the human race. In his view, we cannot leave it up to others to act on our behalf, so creating a self-help community group, which also campaigns for change wherever decisions are made that can affect climate is the way forward.

The groups' aims are to identify where we can reduce our contribution to global emissions, and make a difference towards becoming environmentally sustainable, both as individuals and as groups. To find practical ways for the local community to meet the challenges of climate change.

For example:

- Encouraging maximum insulation and the installation of renewable energy sources for heating and lighting and providing assistance wherever possible for people to achieve this economically and within their means.
- Encourage people to bring bio-diversity to the forefront when choosing how to design and develop their gardens, and in designing and maintaining public spaces.
- Encouraging recycling and making it more accessible to all.
- Encouraging people to eat as much locally sourced food as possible and as much plant-based food as possible.
- To help each other learn about sustainability, about what is achievable and encourage others to do the same.

Going forward we are looking into using a thermal imaging camera so homeowners can actually see where they are losing heat from their homes and how that can be remedied, what financial help is available etc.

Even little things such as a swap shop would be useful, recycling clothes for others in need therefore reducing items that go into landfill.


Lift sharing schemes for people to go to the local supermarket, reducing vehicle usage, providing a sense of community. There are so many small things we can do that have a huge impact.

We wish to be open and accessible to anyone from the community of Kessingland and would love to hear your point of view and ideas.




